questions earlier and I also appreciated that he had some difficulties in struggling with alternatives and I think we all have some of that in what do we do to truly help these young people, not simply to punish but to try and find ways to help them meet their full potential. Senator Wehrbein, I guess my interest or part of my interest here is in the follow-up care, the residential care after they leave the camp. I can understand a little bit from some understanding of an Outward Bound type program what happens at the camp, but in the residential setting I would be interested to know what's entailed there, who's with these young people, a little bit more about how that plays out. And if somebody else has more information than you do, I would be happy to answer it of them...to ask it of them.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Wehrbein?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes. Thank you, Senator Preister. I don't have a lot of information in front of me. One I have is that they're referred back to HHS for placement in a program that specializes reintegration and community supervision. All appropriate youth will eventually return to the community of their origin and/or to a specific relative or guardian, but will remain under local and state supervision for a period of nine months, and that would include the aftercare from this company also and I'm not clear as to how much HHS will have on that too, but the aftercare here is...is part of the cost in this program.

SENATOR PREISTER: So there's some joint responsibility or custody. HHS would have staff that would be doing something possibly and the Brown School would also be doing some follow-up?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I think so, but I would have...I could be clarified on that. I'm not clear how much overlap there is, but I do know the Brown School has an obligation.

SENATOR PREISTER: Okay. And I understand also you said that the program will cost \$3.1 million.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.
