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not know about prior to being placed in this environment. I don't want to see any correction facility, whether it's for juveniles or adults, created primarily for purposes of what they call economic development. It starts out flawed. If this place is designed to be like a factory the product is human beings, so you've got to have people, or product, in that factory and they come from being sentenced there by judges. If judges know there is space available, that's where they're going to send them, and especially black children who now would not be placed in any confined setting will not have a place to be confined, and that I do not appreciate. The only time I hear a whole lot of talk about everybody being treated the same and the law cannot make any distinction is when they want to punish one of us more harshly than they punish a white person and they say, well, justice is blind and everybody got to be punished. But even in that setting the punishments are unequalled. However, this society doesn't mind loading punishment on us. Opportunity? No. Fairness and justice? No. Punishment? Yeah, we'll make up in punishment for everything else you did not get that you were entitled to in this society. So, whereas "Mr. White" would get probation, we'll give you 15 years and there are also a lot of rich people who don't have time to do this sitting in jail so we're going to let you serve some of their time too. So you wind up with these humongous sentences and nobody who examines them years later can understand why you got all that time, but you got it all and you can't get out, and you've got to sit there and sit there, and when you come out the bitterness is there. What do they expect a person to be after being confined under those circumstances for that long a period of time? And then they act like they're surprised when a person behaves as any person would behave who has been prodded, abused, mistreated, perhaps even unjustly convicted and sentenced. This thing of finding another place and saying, well, we didn't have anyplace else to put them, you didn't have anyplace else to put them last year. You didn't have anyplace to put them two years ago. But if HHS was conscious of the fact that some place was needed, why was the only thing they sent out these REPs for would be a Wilderness Camp? Why weren't they busy putting together a plan to deal in a substantive way with the problem and to get at some of these root causes? It goes back partly to the schools, the way children are treated in the schools. It goes back to the way black people are treated on the streets by
