well, we'll put some other temporary expedient in place. If this amendment...if my amendment is adopted, if this camp is not funded, then I will begin to work, and I think there are some senators here who would join me on doing something about the situation at Kearney, and to me that would mean demolishing it, ultimately, and building something closer to Omaha and Lincoln, where the vast majority of the inmates are going to come from. When you talk about family involvement at this so called Wilderness Camp, a lot of poor families are not going to be able, on a regular basis, to make a round trip of 260 miles to participate in this kind of activity, that's clear and it's known. So the logistics have not been worked out. I don't know what kind of medical facilities, what kind of community support services are available in Fillmore or...oh, Fullerton, I'm sorry, Fullerton. I'll get these names correct in time. And these are matters that ought to be worked out, but we're being asked to fund this without knowing anything; even the members of the Appropriations Committee don't have the answers. And what I'm saying is said by way of criticism, in a sense, but not the type of criticism based on somebody having been negligent or slothful or lacking in care. They said that they had been debating it for a long period of time, that it was the last item added to the budget. That shows that, even when they got around to doing this, they were not completely comfortable with what they had done. It then behooves us, as a legislature, to say that before we start a new policy direction there ought to be far more consideration given to this, far more discussion, but most of all solid information, and not just that which came from the people who want the contract. You know what they are going to present. I think it was Senator Preister, and if I'm mistaken I can be corrected, who was asking whether or not there was any information from courts in these areas where this school outfit was talking about a low recidivism rate. And what do they mean by that? If they meant that a child was not sent back to them, is that because, if they come there once and then they go out and they fail they're not sent back to this facility again? Or does it mean...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.
