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PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers, you've spoken three times. You are recognized to close.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, what was just pointed out during...what was just pointed out during that exchange is that Senator Pederson doesn't have the information that we need, I don't have it. But, if the overcrowding is as severe as they say, and if these kids are continuing to come in, and if you put the complete 50 into that camp, you're still overcrowded by 35, and there are more coming into Kearney still, before those are processed out of that camp. So the overcrowding is still there. So, what are they going to do, build another camp for that overcrowding that continues? They lessen it, but they don't correct it. If they would have had a hearing, maybe some of these agencies that are functioning right now could have given them some ideas. But it seems to me that HHS and the administration have no interest in trying to solve the problem. The \$70 million to build a new prison, at one fell swoop, was done. That was a very politically popular thing to do. We have a genuine problem here, and they were given, at the Appropriations Committee, one proposal, one alternative, and they said that because there was no other offer made, this is what we have to take, and we have to take it under these circumstances. And I don't think that's a wise thing to do when it is going to cost \$3 million...in excess of \$3 million a year from now on, and it's not going to solve the overcrowding problem. But let me ask Senator Don Pederson a question.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Pederson, would you yield?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Yes, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Pederson, in order that I not cut you off, were you attempting to tell me that this camp is going to solve the overcrowding at Kearney, and those people from the Brown School looked at all these statistics and figured that, the way things are going now, the number that they send from Kearney to their school...their camp is going to solve the overcrowding problem because the kids will not be coming into Kearney as fast as they were going into this camp? Is that what they told the committee?
