and that confidence level that they gain. So I think that the program itself was very appealing, but I also recognize the fact that we, as a society, have seen a lot of Disney movies, and in the Disney movie, of course, they're always off at a camp or some such situation and everything is going fine until they get into some kind of a dangerous weather situation, or an avalanche comes as they're climbing the mountains together on this camping trip, and then of course the counselor falls and breaks his leg, and the person who had been very hardened and uncooperative, all of a sudden, rises to the occasion and becomes the hero of the movie. But that is a movie and I recognize that that's a movie. But I also recognize that we, here, often times look at things hoping for just that kind of a miracle to occur in the life of a teenager. But I've been listening very carefully and I know that Senator Chambers can speak with more understanding than probably anyone on this floor of what the people in the Omaha community experience when they enter our corrections system. And I think he is telling us that this is not what they need. Now, we might think that this is the answer, but he's telling us he doesn't think it's the answer. He's saying these aren't the skills that they go back and can use on the street to survive. So maybe we need to have more dialogue here and talk about just exactly what kind of skills would be best for them to have. Maybe we need to look at the fact that the whole system needs to be revamped. I know, I came at this very naively, and I thought I'd rather have kids out of doors, in a wonderful camp setting with counselors, than have them in a jail, so it was appealing to me. But I'm going to support AM2819. And, if we ever get there to vote for it, I would welcome that opportunity. Thank you.
