earmark for the Omaha Public Events Facilities Fund is removed upon its expiration, June 30, 2001. And also in this is what I was relating to, about ten minutes ago, there's a reporting requirement for enterprise projects, funded through the Information Technology Infrastructure Fund. And the Chief Information Officer shall provide progress reports to the Legislature on a semiannual basis. And that's the key of the reporting, to report the status of what is going on. We intended to do it to the Appropriations Committee biannually, twice a year, we're looking at already this fall and then again next year when we're in session. So we do have an understanding of where the project is headed and how it's coming along, hopefully to avoid discussions we've had earlier on the CHARTS and other projects, so that we are aware currently, at all times, of the baseline and how the project compares to the original intent. That is added in our amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Chambers, on the committee amendments.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Wehrbein, when we were dealing with LB 1216, yesterday, through one of those complicated, for me, procedures, \$2 million was going to be transferred to this operation. Do you remember that?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, if I remember correctly what I read, that is to have no impact on the General Fund because of some other activity that would occur. So here's the question that I'm asking, not that you go through all of that, but that \$2 million that would go into this program, will have no impact on the sheet that we were talking from yesterday in terms of \$10 million available for senators' A bills. Is that correct?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's right, the one...you mean the previous LB 1216?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right, that was a Cash Fund transfer.
