SENATOR STUHR: Okay, thank you very much and I'm certainly supportive this initiative. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. Further discussion? Senator Beutler, you're recognized to close. Senator Beutler waives closing. The question is the advancement of LB 1379A. Those in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 1379A.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The bill is advanced. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 1407 was a bill introduced by the Appropriations Committee. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 20, referred to the Health Committee, advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending, Mr. President. (AM2597, Legislative Journal page 870.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Wehrbein, you're recognized to open on LB 1407.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. President, members of the body, I will defer to the Human...Health and Human Services Committee because the amendment will become the bill, but this was introduced in response to the child care deficit, and this is a proposal that the committee...our committee sent over to Health and Human Services Committee to look at some possible solutions to at least slowing down some of this deficit, looking at the parameters upon which those are based at this point, and this is what the Health and Human Services committee came up with. As I said, the amendment will become the bill, so I will defer to Senator Jensen.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Jensen, on the committee amendments to LB 1407.
