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they don't have to make that up, but if they don't pass the test, they don't get the second half paid. So that's a revolving fund in the department for that. So 40...\$43,000 or something like that for that first half plus the loan of the second half, that if we're the same, I'm sure our teachers will pass this much more...at a much higher rate than the national but that's it.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, so I don't have to figure on the floor, what do you foresee the rough estimate will be for the...are you \$600,000, \$700,000?

SENATOR THOMPSON: No, probably \$200,000. We'll rec...we'll get that worked up exactly and present it on the bill.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I understand that, but I need...

SENATOR THOMPSON: With this...with this amendment, with the 40 cap of the people applying, it will change the previous fiscal note. Also the fact that the committee changed the \$10,000 to \$7,500.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR THOMPSON: We'll get that to you but we think about \$200,000, first year.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, thank you, at this point.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Sorry.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd like to ask Senator Thompson a question, if I might.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Thompson.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Senator, I assume this is your amendment, and I'm...I'm a little concerned about, you talk about the cap at 40. How do you go about determining who those...I would assume
