the ways that would be...one of the better things for the new neighborhood schools in Omaha is to have as many teachers as possible with their National Board Certification placed in those schools. Now how they get there, Senator Chambers, is a whole different issue. But I had said I just hoped that he wouldn't transfer his frustration and anger that he has towards the Omaha schools and the direction they've gone and what he feels the outcome may be for those schools onto this, because I believe that this does something of value and good. And eventually I do believe, Senator Chambers, there will be teachers with this National Board Certification in those neighborhood schools, and I think they will do a better job of teaching. Otherwise I wouldn't be, as I said, I think we have shared some concerns, I wouldn't be opposing the Tyson amendment. And I hope you can see your light, see the way and also oppose the Tyson amendment until you have a chance to hear a little more on the National Board Certification. And I would hope many of you, if you have any questions, I think at this time that I would hope you would oppose the Tyson amendment and that we could move on and have some further discussion on the bill. Thank you.
