you go to areas with high poverty. These are Master Teachers. I think that we would be not giving them the credit that they deserve, Senator Chambers, to say that they outright would reject wanting to teach in the schools that you're speaking of.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And do you know something? All of these proposals, they're not intended that way. My brother, my cousin, Aguilar, doesn't talk on these issues very much because he knows I will. Imagine for a moment, if we have feelings at all, how we feel when we hear people stand on the floor and say we have to bribe teachers to teach your child. We got to bribe them to teach your child. If they teach your child, we'll bribe them, because something is so bad and so wrong with your children, if they teach my children, we'll bribe them. We're not going to say that there is a standard here that teachers must meet, and if they don't meet it they're fired. We're going to say, you can be a racist and you don't want to teach there, you don't have to. You don't like those kids, don't go there. But, if you do, we'll pay you some extra money because we understand, we know how it is, we know how they are. And I hear these things formalized in legislative programs. And that's why, from now on, I'm going to talk about them every time they come up, until you all get tired of hearing it, so that you know that we're tired of living under it. You don't help us when you bribe these teachers who don't want to be there in the first place. And the only reason they're going to come is because you're going to give them an extra bag of popcorn, another biscuit and a chicken wing, a meat loaf sandwich and a chicken dinner,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and for that they might come and spend some time with our children, and we're supposed to feel those are dedicated people? Those are dedicated teachers? They're the ones who should get \$7,500 more a year? The heavier this bill gets, the less I like the whole bill. I know that's my last time to speak, Mr. President, but I'm going to find a way to speak again. Thank you.
