SENATOR CUDABACK: The committee amendments are adopted to LB 1399. Mr. Clerk, next item.

CLERK: Senator Schimek, AM2777. (AM2777, Legislative Journal page 1021.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schimek, you're recognized to open on your amendment, AM2777.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I will be very brief. I just really want to alert you that this amendment has been filed. The Education Committee is going to have a hearing on it next Wednesday, I believe. Is that correct, Senator Bohlke, next Wednesday? And it is a pretty creative idea that a...actually, a constituent of mine, who's with the Volunteer Service Commission, brought to me when she started reading about teacher shortages. And because I don't want to take too much time here because I think we go off this bill at four o'clock, I'd like to give this bill the opportunity to move forward, so I would just ask you to take a look at this amendment and we'll probably be back on Select File with it. So, with that, Mr. President, I would conclude my remarks.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Seeing no lights, Senator Schimek, did you wish to close on your amendment?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I'd like to withdraw the amendment, have it refiled on Select, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Excuse me, Senator Schimek. Seeing no lights, Senator Bohlke. Senator Bohlke waives closing. The question before the body is, shall LB 1399 be advanced to E & R Initial? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 43 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the motion to advance LB 1399.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 1399 does advance to E & R Initial. Mr. Clerk, next agenda item.
