self-sufficiency contract that the state has with the recipient. Some of the individually determined activities for the recipient are family nurturing classes, preemployment skills, or education. At that time, you informed us that, while in the contract we're forcing, and it's part of the contract we're...a requirement that these individuals have to take these classes. We are, the state, even though we're forcing them to go to these classes, we're not going to pick up the tab for the child care, help them with the child care expenses. And you said that that was a correct observation on my part. Part of the compromise amendment, and that's what I shall refer to it as, for LB 1407 was to rectify that problem. Can you tell me if that issue is resolved somewhat by a commitment of the administration, Senator Jensen?

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Senator Hil...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you respond, Senator Jensen?

SENATOR JENSEN: Excuse me, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Hilgert, for bringing that up. While they're under those requirements they...child care will be covered. We found that out in the meeting at noon and so if...whatever those are before...

SENATOR HILGERT: Okay.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...them and if they're, you know, attending class, if they're doing training, child care is part of that. So that does not take away from that time while they're in those classes.

SENATOR HILGERT: Okay. So once they're in that...if they're enrolled in the class, child care will be provided.

SENATOR JENSEN: That is correct.

SENATOR HILGERT: Thank you, Senator Jensen. I appreciate it. Thank you very much.
