SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that we did have these meetings, we did reach a consensus and the amendment that was to be offered and adopted to the bill is no different from what the Governor has promised to do. And when something is in statute, whimsy cannot be a way to change it; but when people say there is an agreement, whimsy or anything else can intervene and people can say, well, there was a misunderstanding. But I'm going to take Senator Jensen as being the voice of the Governor on the floor for this particular agreement, and I want it crystal clear in the record so that I can get a transcription of what we've talked about and keep it as the pact entered between Senator Jensen and the Governor and Mephistopheles, acting on behalf of you...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...know whom.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Suttle and Senator Chambers. There are no further lights on. Senator Jensen, did you wish to close on your motion to bracket? Senator Jensen waives closing. The question before the body is, shall LB 1407 be bracketed? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the bracket motion of LB 1407. Have you all voted who care to? Have you all voted? Senator Jensen, did you...? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the bracketing of LB 1407.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion to bracket LB 1407 was successful. Mr. Clerk, next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, I believe the Speaker would like to proceed to the committee priority bills at this time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Mr. Speaker.
