have LB 1213. On the reverse side you have the committee amendment. The committee amendment, the authority is given to the school boards of Class I districts to place the issue of exceeding the levy limits for the local system before the voters of the system. The ability of a school board to terminate excess levy authority is limited to the school board that called for the submission of the issue to the voters. Clarification is added to define multiple school...multiple district school systems as single political subdivisions with multiple governing bodies for purposes of the levy limitation provisions. The definition of registered voters for a multiple district school system is modified to reflect the changes allowing any district in the system to call for a vote to authorize excess levy authority. The definition of registered voters currently includes persons in those portions of any Class I district which are affiliated with a part of the system, and the inclusion of those voters continues. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. We are discussing the committee amendments to LB 1213. Senator Beutler, you're recognized.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Bohlke, just a quick question, if I could.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bohlke, do you yield to a question?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: You simply went just a little too fast for me. The way this...the committee amendment...well, let's start at the beginning. With the bill, assuming the committee amendment is adopted, if a Class I wanted to exceed its budget limitation, there would...there would be required to be a vote of all of the patrons of the Class I plus all of the patrons of the school with which it is affiliated. And does that include any other schools that are affiliated with that patron...
