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SENATOR BOHLKE: ...if they are affiliated with more...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...with the system?

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...than one high school, yes, they would have to have approval.

SENATOR BEUTLER: It's everybody in the entire system.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And then if later they want to withdraw that authority, who has the authority to do that?

SENATOR BOHLKE: That would be only the one who had asked for the election, which would be the Class I.

SENATOR BEUTLER: So once they get the authority, they can keep it for as long as the board of the Class I wants to keep it.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes. No, they're...excuse me one minute. Legal counsel says that there are limitations on all school districts when it comes to budget authority--length of time, dollar amounts--so those would apply.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Those would still apply. Is there...is there...there's an overall limitation on the length...I should remember this, too, but I don't. There's an overall limitation...when you vote to exceed your budget or to exceed the levy...

SENATOR BOHLKE: On the...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...when you vote to exceed the levy...let me back up again. We're talking about votes to exceed the levy limitation, is that right?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Before, you were talking about budget, which is the bill. Then, if we go to the reverse side on the amendment, we're talking about levy, exceeding the levy, asking for authority.
