SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...of a majority of the voters within the system.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And now could you just briefly describe for me what happens with the budget limitations.

SENATOR BOHLKE: The budget limitation is...is much the same in that they would have to get approval from all the patrons in the...or a majority of the patrons in the system.

SENATOR BEUTLER: In the whole system. And then they retain that authority. How does that work again?

SENATOR BOHLKE: We do not know the length of time. There's a limitation on the duration.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, there's another duration. They have to get approval again at the end of that duration. Okay, Senator, thank you very much.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Dierks, on the committee amendments to LB 1213.

SENATOR DIERKS: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I think I need to have a little discussion with Senator Bohlke, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bohlke, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes.

SENATOR DIERKS: Senator Bohlke, if I put it in my words, tell me where I'm wrong or if I'm right. If a Class I school district that's affiliated with a Class III or a II wants to go over the...the levy limit, they now, with this amendment, would have the authority to do that? And then, if they did that, the entire school district would vote to either approve that or not approve? Is that the way that works?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Senator Dierks, they would ask for the
