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election, the authority to hold the election, and all the patrons, taxpayers, in both of those districts would have to...a majority would have to approve it.

SENATOR DIERKS: So it would be just one vote and it would be done by the entire district.

SENATOR BOHLKE: That would be correct.

SENATOR DIERKS: The Class I...the entire system, I guess, the Class I district and the Class II district.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Right. And you know that, as I pointed out, I'm sure you heard me say that, and I know you're concerned with the Class I's, that this is not what the Class I's would consider the solution to the ongoing problem.

SENATOR DIERKS: I understand.

SENATOR BOHLKE: I mean that they would not support.

SENATOR DIERKS: I understand that. I think maybe that I intend to have an amendment ready for this bill on Select File that would address this issue, and I hope that we can at that time have some serious dialogue and maybe even before then have some chance to visit about it. Thank you very much.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN PRESIDING

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President and members of the body, Senator Bohlke, I'll probably want to ask you a couple questions, but I want to...think I understand this. The mill levy for the Class I's, they want to raise it and they can ask for an election and then the vote is taken in that district plus whoever else they're affiliated with and the town? So they...I'm thinking about my Round Hill School south of Broken Bow. They're affiliated with Ansley-Broken Bow, both, and so the Ansley School District and the Broken Bow School District and the Round Hill School District all get to vote.
