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SENATOR BROMM: ...and I don't think we need to do it. I think people can discipline themselves. I think they can get a loan and pay partial payments to the lender. I...they do it now through their mortgages, if they have a mortgage. If they don't have a mortgage, I doubt they have any problem really paying the tax in two installments, but I don't know. I don't see the need for it and I'm not going to do anything on General File with that. I'm just letting Senator Wickersham know about my feelings on it and I'll give it some more thought before Select File, but...and I'm not going to vote against the bill because of that, but I'm probably against that provision and I'll try to do some more work on that between now and Select. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Wickersham, seeing no further lights, you're recognized to close on the committee amendments.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you, Mr. President. I am sorry that in the opening I did leave out provisions that concern historical societies and apparently, as you're all reading through, you didn't happen to notice those either. We have entities, there are county historical societies that receive either...that either have a tax levy or receive an appropriation from the county, and we've created a rule that says if they just receive money from the county, up to \$5,000, that they're not...they don't have to file budgets, they don't have to jump through the other hoops. The \$5,000 is accounted for at the county level. It doesn't have to be accounted for again at the historical society level. But if they have a separate levy, then they do have to go through the full budgeting and potentially the auditing process, and they're also subject to allocation within the county's 45-cent levy. So I would call your attention to those provisions concerning historical societies. The issue of voluntary payments, it was interesting that Senator Crosby and Senator Bromm both mentioned that. That has been a long-simmering issue with county assessor...or county treasurers and with taxpayers. We had hoped that by providing for voluntary payments that we would finally put that issue to rest. Maybe we cannot put it to rest even with voluntary payments. We...I will tell you that I had a large amount of personal concern in this issue...in this area because we actually heard from county assessors who were taking partial
