SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Debate on the Chambers amendment? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I think it's pretty obvious that, in addition to the amendment that I'm offering, I don't like Senator Janssen's bill, and we will get into a discussion of that at another time, but this is just the first volley in my war against this bill. If this amendment is not adopted, if this version is not adopted because my colleagues think that the amount is too low by which I'm raising it, I can prepare another amendment to quadruple the amount, or, if my colleagues think that the amount is too high and they're very sympathetic toward the liquor purveyors, they feel very "solicitudeness" toward the purveyors of demon rum and his brothers and sisters and cousins and uncles and aunts to include every kind of beverage, whether you're talking about brandy, I think they drink that out of what they call snifters, those great big glasses that these chunky fellows who are very wealthy hold between the middle...the two middle fingers, they kind of cup it in their palm, they look around very contentedly at everything they have, because they also wear these smoking jackets and smoking jackets that they wear look like checkerboards, Senator Janssen, and everywhere they go they say, you want to play a game of checkers, I'm wearing my board. And that's the kind of people who drink brandy from snifters. I'd like to ask Senator Janssen a question, if I may.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Certainly.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, are there any producers of brandy in Nebraska that you know of?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, Senator, I don't know whether there is or not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are there manufacturers or producers of beer?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Not anymore.
