CLERK: I have nothing further pending to LB 1253, Senator.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. President, I move the advancement of LB 1253 to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The question is the advancement of LB 1253 to E & R. Those in favor say aye. Those opposed say no. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, I believe that concludes all the bills with no other amendments other than Enrollment and Review. LB 1004, I believe the next bill, Senator Smith, Enrollment and Review amendments have been adopted on LB 1004. An amendment by Senator Chambers and Don Pederson has been adopted to the bill. Amendment by Senator Suttle has been adopted; a second amendment by Senator Chambers. Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill, Senator Bromm, AM2740. (Legislative Journal page 1015.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bromm, you're recognized to open on AM2740 to LB 1004.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor and members of the Legislature. When we last spoke of and debated LB 1004 on the floor, there were concerns expressed by at least Senator Hilgert and Senator Chambers about an issue in the bill, and that was whether or not prosecutors and investigating agencies would uniformly and consistently check the out-of-state records of drivers who might be picked up for DUI, so that there would be some assurance that people would be treated with some equity, who do have records in other states, who are arrested in this state. Following that discussion, and Senator Engel agreed to hold the bill back while we worked on it, and we did work on it, and we prepared an amendment which has been introduced by myself, by Senator Chambers, by Senator Hilgert, and by Senator Engel, and I think...I think is acceptable to each of us, and we would like to try to explain it to the body and hope that you'll find it acceptable as well. In two places in the bill, in the section dealing with DUI, and then again in the section dealing with refusal to submit to a test, the amendment inserts, and
