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SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and I'm taking him at his word. Let me ask Senator Engel a question, though,...

SENATOR BROMM: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...since it's on my time.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Sen...Senator Engel, would you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Engel, did you state that you have confidence in the people who are working this bill, and you will trust us to do the right thing...

SENATOR ENGEL: I...I...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...among all of us?

SENATOR ENGEL: I have full confidence in my legal colleagues, yes, I do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And, if Senator Bromm agrees to what we talked about here, you're not worried about anything in that agreement derailing your bill so that you have concerns, is that true?

SENATOR ENGEL: As...as long as...as long as the bill is passed in basically its original intent.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It...well, right, to achieve that purpose. Thank you. I didn't feel that we needed to bring Senator Engel into it because, although I've expressed a little pique, p-i-q-u-e, that doesn't mean I discount everything he has said. He did say that we could...he trusted us to do the work on the bill that we felt needed to be done from this legal aspect. So, with that understanding, I'm not going to try to delay the bill. I don't have an amendment drafted at this time, so I will not, at this point, stand in the way of its moving forward.
