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Excellence in Health Care Fund.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And those core funds that were intended originally, only throw off the interest to be spent, you're going to take \$20 million of that central core money that will not be there for that purpose, but this will do the cigarette cessation program.

SENATOR JENSEN: That is correct, and those dollars, it will be taken off as they come in,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...over three years.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And...

SENATOR JENSEN: We're setting aside \$21 million, but it's \$7 million a year.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And, if my memory is right, I don't have all the numbers, we're eventually, maybe, going to get close to \$1 billion out of that, over 20 years, so this will reduce it by \$20 million, in essence.

SENATOR JENSEN: That is correct.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And so, if we do cigarette tax increase in the future, which for me is not off limits at this point, we could take it for something else, if we so desired, or whatever, whatever, whatever, that's in the future. But this is to go for cigarette cessation...or tobacco cessation, I should be more accurate probably.

SENATOR JENSEN: That is...that is correct. I might add, I believe Senator Landis' bill, if I got my numbers right, would have raised \$23 million. The CDC says Nebraska should spend between \$13 million and \$30 million on a tobacco program.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR JENSEN: This...this \$7 million is not the end of the
