in the letter also that says we just get used to one and we change it again. And I think maybe that is valid. But I don't think we should give up. I know you're a little discouraged, I detected that in your tone of voice. And obviously some in here do get some serious drops in aid. And I was interested in your comments about saying that it didn't intend to pressure, it was not designed to...well, I guess I'll say it the other way. It apparently could have been designed to pressure reorganization. And as it turned out that isn't what it did. I don't know where you intended to head with that. I do know on General File I was...intended to discuss that a little more and we didn't really get to that. But I don't think that we should automatically give it up. And I think we probably ought to be...keep...continue to search. I haven't been the beneficiary of the discussion that I know you've had in Education Committee that I sometimes think all of us should have been able to get at that discussion, not that it can happen. I know everyone should have the benefit of the discussion we have in Appropriations Committee on the state's fiscal issues. And the same could be true in Education, Revenue and otherwise, to have those discussions. So I think it is appropriate to have the discussion here. And I would be interested, frankly as an "outsider", that I'd like to have other comments from the Education Committee members as to what they think of what you're doing and so forth. But I have to say also I appreciate the bracket at this time, because I think it maybe is a little more than all of us can grasp. And it is not necessarily to upset the formulas that we've got in place now. But that doesn't mean that I think that we shouldn't continue to search for better ideas. And so with that, I appreciate the comment that you at least got me in here first, and I want to hear from the rest of the Education Committee.
