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the problem for me was that I didn't know what a demographic ratio, a demographic coefficient, a scale coefficient, preliminary formula cost per student, spending index, spending ratio, I don't know what all those terms mean. And when he tried to explain them to me, after he got done explaining to them...explaining those terms to me, I still didn't know what they meant. It's very hard to vote for something that you don't understand and you can't understand, and I do trust Senator Raikes. He is the learned one when it comes to these kinds of numbers, since he's got his doctorate in economics. I do appreciate his hard work and his attempts to try to make this thick-headed woman from Omaha try to understand what he was talking about, and I'm glad there is going to be a bracket motion to the bill. And I do...I do hope that we can find some way where, as arbitrary figures go, that most everyone is treated fairly and we don't have huge swings one way or the other and look forward to his efforts in the future. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Suttle. Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature. I, too, want to thank Senator Raikes for all of his efforts in this area. I think all of us, since LB 806 was passed, that we have been searching for some way to look at those changes, although we do get criticized, as you said Senator Raikes pointed out, for constantly changing. But change is necessary if we are going to be making progress. I don't...it's interesting, in my district I have nine...the district that I represent, I have 9 school districts; they range in student enrollment from 150 to 1,400, and they are all in the standard cost grouping, and also in the standard cost grouping are schools ranging up to 45,000 students. So, I think that we do...I think that you're on the right track. I think Senator Raikes is on the right track in the fact that we do have to look at other factors that he was proposing--scale of efficiency factor, system cost factor, those are things. But I, too, was like Senator Suttle, difficult, so you're going to have to take it a little bit slower, and I think that we will all be certainly helping, if we can, in this effort. So I want to encourage Senator Raikes to continue and again say we do appreciate your efforts. Thank you.
