SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did you offer a sunset clause to that in case this sprawling operation did not pan out?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, I did not. (Laugh) There are times when I...

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I voted against it. Now let me ask you this, if damage were to result, purely a hypothetical, which would create the most damage to this society as a whole, a failure of HHS or a failure of this commission that we're talking about for the blind? Which would damage society as a whole the most?

SENATOR JENSEN: Certainly a failure of HHS.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But we didn't even think about putting a sunset clause on them, did we?

SENATOR JENSEN: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Jensen, you are aware, as I am aware, that whenever a vulnerable group is being considered and people take a position that seems to be insensitive and heartless and cruel and mean-spirited and vicious and venal, that people who watch that will tend to apply those terms of the person who undertake such an action, even if the person's motive is as pure as the driven snow, you know that can happen.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Jensen, you're aware that you and I have disagreed on issues.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Have I ever applied any of that string of terms to you, based on your disagreement with me on an issue?
