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because, what it does, it creates the Cash Fund and the Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired Cash Fund is created, and it moves the money so that the commission has the money. It doesn't add any money or take any money away, all it does is move the money, if I'm saying that right. You just transfer all the blind funds from HHS to the new blind commission. I can read it to you, "The Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired Cash Fund is created and on the operative date of this act any money in the Small Business Enterprises Cash Fund, any portion of the Department of HHS Services Cash Fund or other Cash Funds attributable to the Division of Rehabilitation Services for the Visually Impaired within HHS shall be transferred to the Commission for the Blind and to this Cash Fund." And it includes all custodial funds, gifts, trusts...gifts, trusts and federal grants that this group has in its possession. So that's all the amendment is and we did it...the Fiscal Office is the one that gave it to us. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Debate on the amendment? Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker, members, I...this is probably appropriate for me to comment at this time because I was going to vote against the bill until I fully understood this, and it has to do a little bit with Senator Crosby's amendment, because I am not one for increasing the commissions. And I've been very reluctant here, I've been...I've been between a rock and a hard spot on this one because I have a very successful Nebraska Center for the Visually Handicapped and the Visually Impaired at Nebraska City, and that's for young people. And I know several people of this nature, and I've been working with them, in fact I was down to the 125th anniversary of the School for the Visually Handicapped in Nebraska City, last Friday night. But I've come to believe, and I understand this, Senator Crosby, and I just...I'd ask you for your assurance, this is not going to be any new funds. This will be a transfer of the General Funds now going to Health and Human Services to support his commission. So this is an advocacy group, but there is no additional General Funds in this procedure. Procedure may not be the right word. But it is a transfer of funds so that there is an advocacy group on its own. And I've been persuaded, as I've gone through the material I had in my file and the fact that it is not additional
