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reasons for coming, of course they do. Everybody who comes in for a bill has their own reasons, because they want the bill and because they feel that what they want will improve the way that the business is being done in a particular agency. And as far as taking this out of HHS I should think, in a way, maybe they'd be glad not to have to worry about this. They have enough problems over there. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Mr. President, members of the body, at the risk of some thought that I don't like somebody, I'm going to support the motion to indefinitely postpone. There has to be some limitation to the special advocacy groups that we create. Senator Wehrbein acknowledged that there are others. I think he's acknowledged that in some cases they might be appropriate. But the fact of the matter is that some place we have to draw the line. Well, there may be other advocacy organizations that I would be willing to vote for, I can't say that I would never vote for one, but I'm not going to be able to vote for this one. The special population that this commission is designed to serve already has a division in an agency to serve them. Creating the commission has a significant fiscal cost, almost \$510,000 per year. Senator Beutler has added an amendment that causes an additional \$8,000 a year to be added to that cost, all well-intentioned, all well-meaning and maybe for the good, but a significant fiscal impact simply to create a commission to serve a special population that is already served through an agency of state government. If we cannot draw the line on special advocacy commissions or boards or commissions at that point, where will we ever be able to draw it? How many special populations will we find then will insist that they too should have their own commission and at what cost? And why cannot we deliver the appropriate levels of services to this special population without the creation of the commission? I think we can. I think that if we need to place greater emphasis on the services that we are delivering to this specialised population then we can direct the Division of Health and Human Services to do that. And hopefully the Health and Human Services would respond to our directive because this is a special population that deserves attention and service and support from the state, but you don't need this commission to do it.
