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Partnership had been put together rather recently and some of the same discussion occurred then as is occurring now. But let me...let me say why...why I can't support the bill. And it's not...it doesn't have anything to do with not wanting to provide adequate services and support for the...for the blind and the visually-handicapped. To me, it is not...that does not enter into the equation whatsoever. We have that mechanism now through Health and Human Services. If we're going to start carving out major parts of the existing duties of Health and Human Services and putting them back into separate agencies then I would suggest we evaluate the entire Health and Human Services organization and do it in a...in a meaningful manner, not taking one at a time and saying we're going to treat this...we're going to treat this function differently than we are other functions. As important as...as it is to provide services for the blind, it is also important to provide services for all other handicap and whether it be deaf or whether it be other...other groups of people who have the unfortunate imparities that the blind do. And so it's not a comprehensive approach to revamping the system and that is one of my major objections. Another objection is that we all go back and tell our constituents that we're trying to do what we can to hold down the growth of government; that we don't want government to increase, except where it is absolutely necessary to serve the people and we'll do everything we can to monitor that. And this...this is looking at this function in a "microism", by itself, without looking at the entire functions that I think are related to this. And so I don't think, as...as worthy as the cause is, I cannot bring myself to do it in this fashion. I think it is going back on what I have told my constituents that I would do and the way I would look at...at decisions involving more or less government. In the short run, you can certainly show that this is a transfer of funds, I guess, and not costing more money. I can assure you in the long run if...I just can't believe that it won't. And if more resources are needed and justified for the blind and visually-handicapped, then we have more total resources available in Health and Human Services as an organization than perhaps this separate agency will be able to garner on their own. If we need to redirect resources within Health and Human Services, we have that ability for any group, including this group. So, I have great concerns about the bill. And it is very difficult, not only because of what I've said, but because
