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I know that Senator Crosby's extremely sincere in what she's doing, but I just have to...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...I have to state my position and why I'm voting the way I am, for the record, and I guess each of us have to evaluate it from the way we see it. I think it's not insignificant that the committee was very divided in their vote. It's not insignificant that an amendment was made which allowed the bill to get to the floor and I think we should respect the committee process in that regard as well. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Lynch. Question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. Question before the body is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Debate ceased. Senator Tyson, you're recognized to close on your motion to indefinitely postpone the bill.

SENATOR TYSON: And while I do so, Mr. Speaker, I would ask for a call of the house.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Question before the body is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay to place the house under call.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The house is under call. Would all unexcused members please report to the Chamber and record their presence. The house is under call. Senator Tyson, while they're coming you may proceed.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I will make my closing on this very short. I think there has been some very, very good discussion on this. I would take issue with one thing and that is that it's only a transference of money. I mentioned, when I
