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saying that this is unique to this bill but an overall concept of subsidizing, giving incentives to create businesses in Nebraska, we wouldn't want, at least some members, wouldn't want to be in the position of having the state create incentives for what would be considered by some people in some areas as a bad neighbor, if you will. I'm not...I just wanted to raise that issue because, again, paying to have a business go into a small town which the small town may not like to have that particular type of business there is just a concern that I wanted to raise. The second was the definition of wage. Wage does not include agricultural tax return. Am I correct in that?

SENATOR MATZKE: No, agricultural earnings would not be wages paid because that's self-employment.

SENATOR HILGERT: Okay.

SENATOR MATZKE: The wage figures come from the Department of Labor and are based upon an analysis of hired employees who are paid wages, not self-employed farmers or other self-employed persons.

SENATOR HILGERT: Because I think it's pretty much a widely...

SENATOR MATZKE: It's a jobs...it's a jobs matter.

SENATOR HILGERT: Yeah, it's pretty widely known how depressed the farm economy is and I noticed that the last...last year that we have that the average income on agricultural tax returns was \$4,700, something very, very low. And I just wanted to make sure that that was not into the calibrations, and you've addressed that. The...

SENATOR MATZKE: Yeah, that's a good clarification. No, that figure does not enter into this calculation at all.

SENATOR HILGERT: And the third concern that I had or point I wouldn't mind bringing up, if you would address, are there any residency requirements? You talk about half of one percent of the labor force of the county. Is that to suggest the existing labor force or could that labor force be skewed by bringing in workers from outside the county?
