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that...to give them...give him this credibility? And that's what they do when they give him the faculty status, they give him credibility, which he does not deserve. So, I'm still asking the question. I'll never get an answer, I don't think. But my last little thing that I will say here, and I think Senator Preister touched on it, all we're asking, we don't want you to stop the research, all we're asking is you do not use the tissue from elective abortions. There are other sources. Thank you, Senator Brashear.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. President, members of the body, thank you all for your attention, consideration, participation. I think it has been a good debate. I suggest that it identifies the kinds of issues with which we're dealing. None of us were a part of the decision, in 1993, to begin the research, nor apparently was the Board of Regents. I'm not into fault finding; I have...to me, this is not about any individual, whether they were here or weren't here, whether they were responsible or not, that's not what we're dealing with. What we have is an issue that greatly divides our public, not just us, our public. I think we're probably all getting letters on both sides of this issue. We need, I think, in our leadership role we have the jurisdiction. It is not for the regents to hear their own case; it is for this Legislature, which outranks that Board of Regents, to take control of this and establish a process by which now the people can be brought on-board in an issue that they were closed out from. They didn't know in '93, you didn't know in '93, I wasn't here and I didn't know in 1993, but today I know. I hear the issues, I hear the questions, I think they're entitled to an answer. We seldom look to Washington for an example of anything, but I notice that they have a related issue involving fetal organs and possible traffic in them, and what do they do? They immediately establish committees in both houses to get at the facts. There are facts here, although all sides seem to think we have all the answers, and that's where we clash is because we're all so positive. I'm not certain we have all the facts here. At some point the people need to be led through the process and we need to conclude how we will proceed.
