SENATOR CROSBY PRESIDING

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Preister, Senator Quandahl, the house is under call. Senator Matzke, the house is under call. Senator Matzke, the house is under call. Senator Chambers, I'm told we cannot find Senator Matzke. Want to go ahead with the vote? Okay. The question is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to LB 1217. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on the Chambers amendment, have you all voted? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Microphone malfunction), Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: A roll call vote had been requested. Mr. Clerk, would you please call the roll?

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken, Legislative Journal Pages 1170-1171.) 20 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President, Madam President, excuse me, on the amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: The amendment fails. I'll raise the call. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Raikes would move to amend, AM2964. (Legislative Journal page 1171.)

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Raikes, you're recognized to open on your amendment.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Madam President, members of the Legislature. I have passed around a couple of pieces of paper for you relative to this amendment. One of them is sort of three or four lines. It describes what it does. And the second one is a table of numbers that come from the State Department of Property Assessment and Taxation. Let me begin my introduction of this by reminding you last year's...of last year's LB 881, which was a property tax relief measure introduced at the request of the Governor. The way that ended up is that there
