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SENATOR VRTISKA: That's what I'm getting at. Is that...that's how you...that's how you hold spending is by the cap that's in there, so they can't...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: There are...

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...go ahead.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator, I don't mean to interrupt but there are two controls on spending. One is the levy limitations and the other are...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...the budget limitations.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay, I'm just trying to get those things straight in mind because looking at this quickly I wasn't able to quite understand if there was an increase in valuation how it would, in fact, reflect back and not, in fact, produce more money. But what you're saying, with those caps that can't happen.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: They can...they can have some growth but it's within the budget limitations.

SENATOR VRTISKA: All right. Thank you very much.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Kristensen, on the Raikes amendment.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you. Thank you, Madam President, members of the Legislature. Senator Vrtiska, I appreciate your comments in support of the community colleges. They are doing a great job. That's exactly the reason I introduced that constitutional amendment that would allow one of our state colleges to enter into that great system that you like, and, hopefully, we can get that job done some day. You don't have to set your jaw, Senator Vrtiska. That won't happen this session. It's okay. There is one other thing I'd like to talk to you about, Senator Vrtiska, and that is the formula the community
