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obviously, are open for change and I'm not suggesting that we're frozen into that path, but that...that's the history from my point of view and the reason that I wouldn't vote for your amendment at this point in time. I yield any time I have remaining to Senator Raikes, if he'd like it.

SENATOR CROSBY: Got about one minute.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. While you're there, let me point out one question I have, which maybe nobody else has. But on the handout you...you distributed, there is a revised property tax number, number two, at \$18,805,000. On the sheet I handed out, the 1999 taxes levied by the certificate of taxes levied is \$30,598,000. Can you tell me where...where is that \$12 million, or roughly \$12 million?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I can, but I need to grab your sheet just to make sure.

SENATOR RAIKES: Oh, I'm sorry.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: And I'll...

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay, well, that's one issue I would like to...while you're looking, I'll just mention the one-time thing has been mentioned several times, and I would remind you that a transfer to the cash reserve is a one-time...

SENATOR CROSBY: Time.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...transfer also. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Raikes, your light is next so you can continue if you'd like to.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Madam President and members. Senator Kristensen, too, I'll, when it looks like you're ready to respond, I'll recognize you so you...
