A bills and the press reported on this in the Omaha World-Herald, it was thought that that was the end of everything, that they would not get any more property tax. At least the people who called me from my district, they were irate. They were furious that Senator Beutler would take \$10 million away from their property tax relief. I don't believe that's what he did. What I would...what I would say is that this \$10 million was putting that \$10 million back and we're keeping the rest for cash reserve. I think that is prudent use of money. We're not spending too much. We're keeping to the promise that we made last year in the original budget, and I think that this is the way we should go. They will still see a reduction in their property taxes, and we're not doing any more or any less than we promised to do in the original budget, and I would urge you to support Senator Raikes' amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Suttle. Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam President. And, Senator Raikes, just to respond to you at least on the record, the difference between the two figures is that the calculation that I handed out, as you'll see, is data we used from this year but it is computing based on the levies and what the formula is going to do. Yours is a calculation of taxes that were actually levied and collected. Those would have been the 1998 real estate taxes that they were levied. So included in your \$30 million is the capital improvement levy, and then that would have been the actual taxes collected for 1998. The one I'm showing is what...how the \$30 million will actually be done for the upcoming year. So there's a...there's a different, they are sort of an apples and oranges number, but I'd...

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Raikes, will you respond?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: ...allow Senator Raikes to respond.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay, thank you, Senator Kristensen. So tell me this.
