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from the state was 60,598,000 and so on dollars. Can you tell me if I've made a mistake that far?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Well, it depends on what you're trying to get at for a final number there.

SENATOR RAIKES: I'm trying to get at the total amount of money available to community colleges through the property tax levy...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Oh, okay.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...and through the \$30 million that the state provided in effect to replace property taxes.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: If the difference would be that you have to fully fund, and I'm going to try to think of a quick way to do this, you have to fully fund the community college system first using 40 percent of property taxes and then 40 percent of state aid, and then there's another 20 percent through a different aid formula, but it's a...it's the current community college formula. And so what you're doing is you're taking total property taxes and just taking out \$30 million. That's not exactly how the aid formula works. I think that's the difference between my handout and yours. Mine runs it through the operational formula which amounts to...well, there's 80 percent of it in that right there, so there's going to be a little difference.

SENATOR RAIKES: Well, okay. And, quite frankly, I wouldn't expect, even in the most optimistic circumstances, that the \$30 million would be realized to the full dollar. I would have expected there would have been some increase in operational levy which could reasonably be reflected as a reduction of the \$30 million. So I guess I'm stuck at a point here where...where 25 out of the 30 seems low, 30 out of the 30 seems high, and I...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Okay.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...don't know where the correct place is.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I see what you're saying. Okay. Yeah, I
