SENATOR SUTTLE: They apparently had two above.

SENATOR BROMM: ...two above the goal, and now this year they're one below the goal, but cumulative they would be one above the two-year progress point?

SENATOR SUTTLE: Yes, sir.

SENATOR BROMM: I'm missing something. If we're...

SENATOR SUTTLE: I think that if...

SENATOR BROMM: ...if we're going to quibble about being one below after they were two above the previous year, then I'm missing something, I'm sorry. Did we reward them for being two above?

SENATOR SUTTLE: No, sir.

SENATOR BROMM: Did we...did we pass a resolution complimenting them?

SENATOR SUTTLE: I don't know. I don't...I don't think so.

SENATOR BROMM: I...I am missing something and if I'm the only one on this floor then so be it. But...but we have a lot of...we have a lot of things to accomplish and the university is a big part of that. We spent a lot...we spent some time on them this morning, we'll spend some more time on them later, but in my way of thinking if someone who has charged with this kind of a...of a goal and it's a...I applaud the goal. I applaud the effort and so I don't want my remarks to be interpreted otherwise. But the point of my remarks is this, that we should look at the accomplishments of an institution like that over more than a month period, over more than a six-month period, over more than a year period. In fact, if I understand this right, this is a five-year goal, a five-year goal that they're trying to accomplish. Two years into that five-year period they are one above where cumulative...cumulatively their goal was to be, and...and...and we're going to do something because we are displeased with that. I am missing something, and...and if this is just to make a point then that's fine, but please don't spend
