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\$3.5 million or \$1.5 million or whatever to make a point that, to me, is a very hollow...a very hollow point. If they are, in fact, one above where they were supposed to be after two years I would applaud them...

SENATOR COORDSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...because they have made progress and apparently they are...they have taken the charge seriously and so I...I'm just not supportive of this amendment. I don't...I do not understand the...the ends here that we're trying to get to. The means don't...don't justify the ends here. I...I do not understand this and I will not support this amendment, I will not support the Chambers amendment unless someone can stand up here and tell me what we are doing here that I am missing. We had a goal. We have a five-year goal. If they were significantly behind where they should be at the two-year point, I hope I would be right in there pitching, but they are one above where they were...their goal was to be and...and...

SENATOR COORDSEN: Time.

SENATOR BROMM: ...we're taking action. I don't think this is wise. I don't think it will be viewed wisely by others. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Hilgert, please.

SENATOR HILGERT: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I think, like Senator Bromm, I think I'm missing something too on this. Last year, and, Senator Suttle, I may ask you a couple questions.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Suttle, would you respond?

SENATOR SUTTLE: Yes.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you.

SENATOR HILGERT: Yeah, let me set them up. It seems to me that one of the reasons why they didn't make their goal last year is
