restructured. It just...it is just way too much money to be a grant program. Eventually, a bunch of that money needs to be taken and used to fund some particular vision of our health-care system. Many people think that that particular vision should be a public health system for the state of Nebraska, that is filling in all gaps in our public health system and rounding out a comprehensive public health system with this money. That may be what they come up with and it may be something different, but I think it's important to deliver a message to the people interested in that program that what is there today is a grant program, that it should be thought of as such, and that it not...should not be a means of funding ongoing appropriations for essentially programs that they would have the power to set up and continue to fund under the current way that program is structured. They could do that without any further authorization from the Legislature. So, to encourage that whole process and to further define what we have here and what we intend, what this amendment does is simply to say this: no project shall receive funding for more than three years through such grants unless the council determines that unusual circumstances dictate the need for an extension of the funding. Extensions shall be granted for no more than one year at a time and shall be reported to the Health and Human Services Committee. That's the first half of the amendment, the idea being that a grant program should be that; it should be for experimental kinds of things. If they work out then they should come back to the Legislature for permanent funding for that program if they think it's a good program. But it should not be a situation where that advisory committee simply dictates a legislative program without legislative approval and...and, reinforcing that particular idea, it further says...the amendment further says: such projects shall not include permanent, ongoing programs unless approved by the Legislature. The department or the council may recommend projects to the Legislature for establishment as permanent, ongoing programs to be funded from the fund. And then, if they do that: permanent, ongoing programs approved by the Legislature shall be fully funded on an annual basis prior to the use of the fund for any other project funded from the fund pursuant to the grant program. So if they do that it envisions how the priorities will be within that system. That's all the amendment does. I don't know if Senator Jensen is favorably inclined or not. I
