PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...of the law stand, that is totally, absolutely mistaken. Now I don't know who the counsel is or who the counselors are who have arrived at that conclusion but, obviously, there are more of them than there are of me, so if the majority rules, more of them have said the court will do that and I'm the only one who says that the court won't do it.
