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SENATOR VRTISKA: Senator Wehrbein, your amendment, as I understand it, says a feasibility study. When...does this feasibility study take place before the bill actually...this bill doesn't take place for another, what?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I...beginning July...June 1st of 2002, year and a half.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. So what this does is, in the interim, is does a feasibility study to determine the necessity and the value. Is that right?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, and that report for the study is due November 15th of 2001.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. That's...that's the question I had, is when the...when the report would come down, so that the...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...Legislature would have a chance then to take action if they want to continue or not to continue, whichever might be the case. Is that...that was your intent,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...I assume.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay, that answered my question. I was curious about the dates. And, with that, thank you very much.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, Senator Wehrbein, if you'd answer a question.
