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into our living room things that I don't even begin to understand. And down in the basement of grandma's house is another little device that I can punch in 68370 which, Senator Redfield, happens to be my zip code, and the gremlins within that box bring to me instantaneously the weather report for 68...weather forecast for 68370, digitized right down to the zip code. Now the reason I mention these things is simply this. How many members here have an outside antenna? Not many, not very many. You either get your local television through a cable outlet or you get other stuff, that stuff I do not understand, through a digital television service satellite broadcast. I would wonder and I would ask I suppose since Senator Kristensen is the guru of this on the floor on his time he can respond and that is if in fact there's ever going to be an investment of this magnitude in line site broadcasting in the state of Nebraska. Why would you do that? I don't know the answer to that. I'm asking a question. I think we are perched on, almost immersed, Senator Chambers, in an information pool that doesn't depend upon what is virtually line of site method of transmission. We have gotten to the place where we will soon have, if we don't have already, satellite communication that will be local specific where you may well have a broadcast studio assembling the information of your locality in the same manner that many cable systems provide a local access channel. But I think the day of broadcast television as we know it is in fact past, Senator Kristensen, and that we may well not see the investment made in digital television in that manner. If there is some encouragement for those people who are still depending upon the rabbit ears or whatever that thing is that the trees knock off your house every time the wind blows, then if we can encourage some entity not located in the state of Nebraska to invest several million dollars in the state that we wouldn't get otherwise to advantage our citizens, perhaps we ought not to measure that in absolute dollars. So, with that I'm sure you're sorry that one of the Pages or some unidentified people pushed my button, but I believe we're not talking about a world that we're going to be living in. Thank you.
