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a sales tax break. And, therefore, I will not be supporting the Wickersham amendment nor will I be supporting LB 171. I'm not voting for any sales tax exemptions this year. It's too expensive. We're being threatened by the Governor to veto everything that costs money and, therefore, this is a rather expensive bill, and I think this is the beginning of where our priorities must begin by looking at where we have to cut and this is where we could begin. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Suttle. (Visitors introduced.) Debate on the Wickersham amendment. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, we in the culture corner don't just spread culture everywhere else. It's kind of sent back and forth. And Senator Suttle just persuaded me that, despite my urge to dig Senator Kristensen by voting for Senator Wickersham's amendment, I will not vote for Senator Wickersham's amendment because it would constitute granting of an exemption to somebody even if we ultimately voted to kill the bill which is I hope what we will do. I listened to Senator Jones. Now I understood him the other day when he was explaining freeze-dried branding. It's not freeze-dried. (Laugh) I wanted to see if anybody was listening. The rubes didn't get it. The city slickers didn't get it. They were just not, yeah, we understood that, too. But I did understand that. Now when he was talking just a minute ago, I couldn't make head or tail of what he was saying. I think he said that these are not businesses or something like that. Something is not a business that he was talking about. Well, these are people in business. They do choose to be in this business. They are given a prerogative that not one of us individually or the group of us collectively could do. Do you realize that if we put together enough money to erect a television station where we can transmit, we are not free under the law to do that? We have to be given permission. We have to get permission from the government and they're going to tell us what bands or whatever those mysterious things, I'm like Senator Coordsen now, things I don't understand. But they tell us where we can...how we can send our signal out there. So when these people get these licenses, they're given something that nobody else can have, nobody else legally can intrude upon, and they like it like
