SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...but if you're doing business in a start-up business it's a lot of money and that's what in this bill we need to look at. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Senator Chambers, on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm serious about all of my amendments. SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Bourne?

SENATOR BOURNE: I will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bourne, how much money is going to be involved in this bill the first year?

SENATOR BOURNE: I think it's about \$500,000.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And people have been saying that the purpose of the bill is to rescue these little towns. Generally, that's what's being said. Is that true?

SENATOR BOURNE: I don't know about rescue, but I...help.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Helping to keep them viable.

SENATOR BOURNE: Exactly.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. That's all that I'm going to ask you. And I'll tell you why I chose "Luke". Because there are parables written in various of the gospels and if \$500,000 is going to help keep these towns going and save them, makes me think of the time that Jesus was looking at 5,000 people and they had no food but everybody was hungry.
