have we got here? They brought three little fishes and five loaves of bread, and Jesus began to break the fish into pieces, break the bread into pieces, and told his disciples, distribute these three fishes and five loaves among all of these people. And the disciples said there are people beyond my range of vision, what are you talking about? He said, you just do what I told you to do and I'll take care of the rest of it. So they're kind of smirking behind their hand (laughs), people have said he's crazy, now this proves it, so we'll just go along, because they didn't believe either. So they started taking these little bits of fish and bread and they'd go here and look in their basket and there's still some more. They'd go a little farther, there's still more, and by the time they got through everybody was fed. And, besides that, they did what the Legislature would never do. They took up baskets of food left over and distributed it to the poor. Now the poor will get leftovers from this Legislature, but they're scraps and you'd have to put on those scraps what I often see on these big tanker trucks on the highway--un-edible, not for human consumption. That's what the Legislature gives the poor. But back to this matter. This little bit of money is going to save these towns. Preposterous. I know it and everybody knows it. Senator Coordsen is touching on some of the realities. Others, out of a sense of desperation, are saying something is better than nothing. I don't agree. The Governor could have put some real money into something like this and they could have lowered the amount that is required in order to qualify, and they could have eliminated certain parts of the state from even being able to get into this program so there is no overlap between LB 775 and this one. But that's not done. And if I don't bring these things up they don't get discussed on the floor, and they ought to. The worst thing in the world is to have us go through an involved discussion that the public is not going to follow, it's not going to be reported accurately or in detail in the media because it's too wide-ranging, but what will be reported is that a bill was enacted that is going to rescue rural Nebraska. And then suddenly they see you got a great big old basket saying save rural Nebraska and you climb up on your stepladder and look down in it; you don't see anything. There's nothing in the basket. This bill is not...
