SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator, not to be coy but, you know, quite frankly, it's going to depend on what the situation looks like at the time. You've seen that other bills we've had this year and maybe the other...the next round of committee bills may have limits, that if there are other substantive amendments that they don't get rescheduled for the next round. We've got to start to prioritize a little bit of what absolutely needs to get done, what we would like to get done, and what would be convenient, and somebody is going to have to make those priority decisions. I don't know what it's going to look like on Select File. Maybe we're going to have lots of things already completed; maybe we don't get any further than we are today.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker, would you like me to help you establish the priorities for the rest of the session?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I can do just fine myself, thank you.

I don't even accept senior discounts when I go to the restaurant because the term turns me off, and I don't think old people ought to get breaks just because we've been here longer than anybody else. As a matter of fact, the only reason I don't fulfill one of Jesus' parables or statements--why do the wicked grow old and prosper. Well, I've grown old but I haven't prospered so I'm not necessarily wicked, but actually I am. That brings me in to what I'm going to say on this bill. Everybody probably has something they'd like to attach to a bill. It shouldn't fall to me always to do these things, but I'm going to continue to do it and I'm going to do it with a greater vengeance now.
