SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. So, if it's listed up above, then it's okay, even though it's a retail sale operation.

SENATOR MATZKE: I don't understand the question.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, I...

SENATOR MATZKE: You have a broad definition of...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...I'm trying to get to the general intent. The only...the only retail sale operations that you...that you intend to allow to qualify would be those that are listed in 14(a), (i), (ii), (iii), (iv), and (v) above, right? Is that the way it should be read?

SENATOR MATZKE: Well, actually one of the technical amendments amended that paragraph to be paragraph 13, but...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Thirteen.

SENATOR MATZKE: ...nevertheless, it's line 1 of page 4.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, thank you, Senator.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Beutler. (Visitors introduced.) Further debate on the Chambers amendment? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I heard Senator Matzke's explanation about the 80 percent food that is prepared for immediate consumption, but I doubt that there's any business which would have 80 percent of its business consisting of a cafeteria. And if a cafeteria, which means you sell food, is what the bulk of its business consists of, it is really a restaurant. Now I'd like to ask Senator Matzke a question.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Matzke.

SENATOR MATZKE: Yes, Senator Chambers.
