

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE
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SENATOR MATZKE: ...I simply don't know the answer.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I don't...I'm not talking about licensing or regulation. There are large companies that do this, isn't that true?

SENATOR MATZKE: That's correct, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And this bill is designed to bring some of those companies into rural Nebraska to engage in this kind of activity, isn't that true?

SENATOR MATZKE: I wouldn't say the bill is designed to do it. I think there needs to be some...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then, if we strike this language,...

SENATOR MATZKE: ...clarification. This does not involve temporary employees, this involves full-time employees. Now there is an explanation for this, and I'll either do it on your time or my time, whichever you wish.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If this...I'll let you do that on yours, because I want to ask you a couple of questions. If this language were stricken, it wouldn't hurt the bill because these kind of companies are not going to come to rural Nebraska anyway, are they?

SENATOR MATZKE: I think you're right, Senator Chambers, I don't think it would hurt the bill if these sections were stricken.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, then I...I'll...

SENATOR MATZKE: There...there's only a couple of instances where it might apply. I would explain that on my own time. I don't know that that's critical.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, if you're not going to oppose the striking of it, I won't take a lot of time on this amendment, because my interest at this point is not to just use a lot of time to kill the bill; I'm like Senator Beutler, working my way through it.
