SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. That's what I was trying to get at.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: And with...but...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Members of the Legislature, this arrangement that would be possible under the language I want to strike does not insure the employees of anything. They will get no more than what the company that qualifies under this bill wants to give them. We have no requirements currently in the bill that these companies provide any benefits. So, if a company can hire individuals without giving them any benefits, that's the basis on which the hirings will take place. This parent company would not even have to enter into the picture. The company that is going to qualify under this bill can hire the employees from the area where the company is located, give them this salary, this wage, which I...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...say is low and is going to stay low under this bill, and not give benefits. So, I don't see where this language should be in the bill. That parent company is not going to move to a rural area and conduct its operations there, so it doesn't need to be in the bill. But I have other objections to the terminology, which some people might think is trifling, but I don't like language in the law that treats people as commodities. And I'm sure that even if this were to be done, there can be some other language than "leasing employees", "leased employees", unless the employees would be livestock. This reduces human beings to the level of livestock, in my opinion. But the language is not essential to the operation of the bill anyway, and I think there are other things in the bill which are not essential to its operation.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. On the Chambers' amendment to the committee amendments, Senator Quandahl.
