SENATOR CHAMBERS: So why is it that, simply because a company wants to receive benefits under this bill, would they not be allowed to do as you can do now without having language like this in the law? Isn't this a contractual relationship between you and whatever company you're dealing with?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Yes, it is.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you don't need any affirmative authorization from the law...under the law to do what you're doing, obviously, because you're doing it.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So, why couldn't the companies, under this bill, who would qualify under this bill, do the same thing without this language?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: I'm not sure if I could answer that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And companies exist, at least one company exists which is doing this right now.

And I want to take out of the bill whatever is unnecessary.
